Climate action charity offers \$5,000 Innovation Award

Citizens Own Renewable Energy Network Australia (CORENA) is pleased to announce that nominations are now open for the CORENA Innovation Award.

The award recognises an **innovative and creative emissions reduction project or initiative**, as assessed against CORENA's judging criteria. It has been established in honour of **CORENA's founder, Margaret Hender**, whose pioneering spirit led to the founding of CORENA in 2013.

The value of the 2025 Innovation Award is \$5,000 - which can be applied as a one-off cash contribution to the recipient organisation, for the implementation of the winning project or initiative, or as an offset against a CORENA loan to support the implementation of the project or initiative. The **Innovation Award winner** will be announced in January 2026.

Eligibility Criteria

Applications are open to:

 Any organisation or individual pursuing a project or initiative to reduce carbon emissions.

Project Requirements:

- The project or initiative must be in the early stages of development i.e. the award will not be awarded retrospectively to an established project or initiative, unless for expansion purposes.
- The award funds must be important in achieving implementation of the project or initiative.
- The applicant may or may not also be pursuing a loan with CORENA.
- CORENA employees, contractors, committee members and their immediate families are not permitted to apply.

Self-nominations and **nominations by others** are both accepted.

Judging Criteria

Eligible applications will be judged by the CORENA Committee against the following criteria:

- 1. The project or initiative will achieve a demonstrable, long-term reduction in carbon emissions:
- 2. The project or initiative employs innovative or novel solutions to achieve carbon emission reductions:
- 3. The project or initiative employs an emerging technology to reduce carbon emissions;
- 4. The project or initiative serves as an example, or blueprint for future projects or initiatives or otherwise demonstrates growth potential; and
- 5. The project or initiative advances our energy system towards a cleaner economy.

Applications must address item number 1 of the judging criteria, plus at least one of items 2 - 5.

CORENA (Citizens' Own Renewable Energy Network Australia) operates Australia's longest-running donor-driven **revolving fund for climate action**. To date, CORENA has funded over **\$1.85 million** for **60 projects**, avoiding more than **7991 MWh** of grid electricity — equivalent to powering 377 average homes with 100% renewable energy.
